

Stabilization

In-Service Recruits (ISR's) are Soldiers who transition from the U.S. Army directly into the TXARNG through a Reserve Component Career Counselor (RCCC).

Effective 1 October 2010, ISR's who enlist through this program *will not* be involuntarily mobilized for OCONUS missions to include, but not limited to, Operation New Dawn or Operation Enduring Freedom during their first *24-months* of TXARNG service.

Texas will honor up to 24-months of the original stabilization period issued by another state for In-Service Recruits completing an interstate transfer to the TXARNG.

Benefits Include:

100% Tuition Assistance—up to \$18,000 over four years

The Post-9/11 GI Bill

National Guard Scholarships that can pay up to full tuition plus an allowance

Federal Tuition Assistance

The Guard can pay **up to 100% of your college tuition** and general fees, up to \$4,500 per year—that's up to \$18,000 over four years. The amount is based on in-state public tuition rates, and can be applied to the other financial assistance programs listed below.

Montgomery GI Bill

In addition to paying your college tuition, you may qualify for a monthly expense allowance of over \$300—about \$11,000 over a four-year period. Best of all, this money is sent directly to you.

Post-9/11 GI Bill

For Soldiers with at least 90 days of Active Duty service on or after September 11, 2001, the Post-9/11 GI Bill can cover up to 100% of your tuition, depending on the length of time you've served. You may also be eligible for an annual stipend of \$1,000 for books and supplies.

The Hazlewood Act

If you are a Texas Service Member or Veteran, you may qualify for the Hazlewood Act. The Hazlewood Act provides qualified Veterans an education benefit of up to 150 hours of tuition and fee exemption at Texas state-supported colleges or universities.
